Objectives

In 2017 the SCRS elaborated a work plan for 2018 which included an intersessional meeting to continue its work on the LLSIM simulation study on developing best practices for CPUE standardization. The Group will also continue to work on how best to bring spatially changing oceanographic, environmental conditions and climate change into the assessment process. An ongoing issue for the Working Group has been the discussions regarding the Management Strategy Evaluation (MSE) Process. The Group aims to continue these discussions as well as address Harvest Control Rules, Limit, Threshold and Target Reference points. The Group also encourages papers, discussion and debate on how to efficiently characterize uncertainty in assessment models and maintaining consistency between assessments, and Data Limited methods in stock assessment.

In 2015 the SCRS "proposed that a new deadline for the submission of SCRS documents should be implemented; these documents should be provided in their entirety at least one week before the meeting in which they are to be presented to facilitate their review by participating scientists prior to these meetings". Furthermore, the original documents (text, tables and figures) should be prepared in WORD or compatible software.
