

#### **2020 SECOND INTERSESSIONAL MEETING OF THE ICCAT BLUEFIN TUNA SPECIES GROUP** (Online, 20 - 28 July 2020)

## Objectives

- 1. Assessment: Review results and initial projections, draft management advice and initial draft of executive summary
- 2. MSE: Examine OMs overall performance over different CMPs to identify behaviour that might not match earlier perceptions or that could be difficult to explain based on current knowledge. Consider possible modification of axes to be included in interim grid, and designation of most important robustness trials.
- 3. Review progress on 2020 responses to the commission regarding growth in farms and best catch rate table

While the nature of the SCRS annual meeting remains uncertain, the intention of the Bluefin Tuna Species Group is to maintain the path forward outlined in the May meeting. The focus of the meetings will be on the stock assessment, MSE and responses to the Commission. Hence, only papers directly relevant to the above-mentioned objectives will be scheduled for presentation. Other scientific papers will be accepted but we cannot guarantee that there will be time to present them and they will be presented at the end of the meeting, if time permits. Participants are encouraged to submit relevant scientific papers. In order to better organize the meetings, in 2014 the SCRS established deadlines for submitting documents, which were revised in 2015. These deadlines provide the rapporteurs with valuable information to better fit the meeting timetable as well as allow the Secretariat to make the documents available to participants in advance of the meeting. In 2015 the SCRS "proposed that a new deadline for the submission of SCRS documents should be implemented; these documents should be provided in their entirety at least one week before the meetings". Authors are reminded to closely follow the <u>Guidelines for Authors of Scientific Documents for the ICCAT SCRS and Collective Volume Series</u>. Furthermore, the original documents (text, tables and figures) should be prepared in WORD or compatible software.
