## **Objectives**

The focus of the meeting may be on several decision points for the MSE. These include possibly adopting the reference grid and the approach to plausibility as well as decisions regarding GBYP future activities including consideration of the advice from the external peer review of the aerial survey. This meeting will also discuss how to identify the pool of scientists who will conduct the initial poll for plausibility weighting.

In 2015 the SCRS "proposed that a new deadline for the submission of SCRS documents should be implemented; these documents should be provided in their entirety at least one week before the meeting in which they are to be presented to facilitate their review by participating scientists prior to these meetings".
