2021 INTERSESSIONAL MEETING OF THE BLUEFIN TUNA SPECIES GROUP (INCLUDING W-BFT DATA PREPARATORY)

Objectives and Background

The SCRS gives priority to the MSE process in 2021 but also recommends focused research efforts from specified Technical Sub-groups to address key uncertainties identified in the 2020 update assessments. At this meeting, the BFT Species Group will discuss the on-going OM and CMP development, the updated indicators and data used in the MSE to 2019, the result of poll for OM weighting, as well as the progress of the Sub-groups.

Key events planned for this meeting are: Plausibility weighting of OMs; Adoption of the Reference grid; and drafting of the terms of reference for the MSE code review. Regarding any changes to the indicators used for the MSE or the W-BFT assessment, the BFT SG will need to either adopt the changes, choose to exclude the index or the previous index will remain.

Since a stock assessment for the western BFT in 2021 has been requested by the Commission, the BFT SG will review available data and indices for this assessment to 2019, and also draft ToRs for the assessment at this meeting. Indices used for the assessment and the MSE are undergoing revision, as noted above. Given the timing, the assessment will only be able to entertain limited changes to other input data and model structure. We do not anticipate deviating from the current model advice framework of stock synthesis and VPA.

Furthermore, the original documents (text, tables and figures) should be prepared in WORD or compatible software.

In view of the western bluefin stock assessment, CPCs are requested to submit Task 1 and Task 2 data (until the year 2019 and if possible 2020, two weeks before the beginning of the meeting (19 March 2021).
