SUBJECT: INTERSESSIONAL MEETING OF BLUEFIN TUNA SPECIES GROUP (hybrid/ Sliema, Malta from 15 to 18 April 2024)

Following the adoption by the Commission of the SCRS meetings scheduled for 2024, I would like to inform you that the Intersessional Meeting of Bluefin Tuna Species Group has been scheduled from 15 to 18 April 2024. The in-person meeting will have a hybrid format and will be held at the **Waterfront Hotel**, Sliema, (Malta). The local organizers are offering a special rate (per night) for the following five nights' accommodation at the Waterfront Hotel (14-19 April 2024):

- Single room (incl. breakfast): €150
- Double room (incl. breakfast): €160

In order to organize the hybrid meeting in advance of the session, in particular, regarding the number of inperson participants, you are kindly requested to send to the Secretariat a list of delegates who will participate in the meeting by **5 April 2024**, at the latest. Any late submission of the official delegation may cause a delay in providing access to participants to the meeting and the related documents. All participants (online and in-person) must also register for the meeting using the online registration form which is/will be available on the ICCAT meeting webpage by **5 April 2024**.

Intersessional Meeting of Bluefin Tuna Species Group (Hybrid/Sliema, Malta from 15 to 18 April 2024)

Objectives

The SCRS will hold an intersessional meeting in 2024 focused on the elaboration of a proposal for the implementation of the close-kin mark recapture (CKMR) methodology for the eastern bluefin tuna, in coordination with the ongoing CKMR study on the western bluefin tuna. The meeting will focus on a) progress of modeling and genetic studies, b) sampling needs and identifying sampling opportunities to obtain the necessary biological samples and age information, c) coordination of sampling across CPCs and d) identifying financial resources to support a pan-Atlantic CKMR implementation. CPCs should send staff who are knowledgeable in their domestic bluefin tuna sampling and about how such programs could support CKMR. The meeting will also take scientific papers on any of the topics included in the tentative agenda below.
